As many as five deaths have been reported due to drug overdose in the district in the past one week.

On July 2, a youth died of

The petition er approached the high court by filing a revision petition on December 15 last year under

But the petitioner did not assail the judgment passed by the Sessions Court within the statutory limitation pend of 90 days. As such, he filed an application under Section, 5 of the Limitation Act, seek. ing condonation of 38 days delay Justice Chitkara assert ed technically speaking crin inal revision petition would not be considered pendi not be considered pending before the high court unless

the delay was condoned.

"The proposition of law that sprouts is that the time-barret sprouts is that the time-barnel petitions filed up to June 3), under the CPC, accompanied with applications under Section 5 of the Limitation Act pending as of July 1, if the delay is condoned, will be governed under the CPC, 1973 or BNSS, 2023? ice Chitkara observed.

Referring to the provisions of law, Justice Chitkara asserte the effect of condonation was the effect of condonation was that the delay was excused, and the plea was treated as if it were filed within the original limitation period. Consequent, by it related back to the date when the limitation period expired. This date becomes the determining factor, and the procedure amplicable on th procedure applicable on that date would govern the plea Before parting with the order Justice Chitkara asserted the petition would be adjudicated under the provisions of the CrPC and not BNSS.
